### **Materials List**

#### **Paper**

A good quality paper. If you are comfortable with a certain type, bring it! I know a lot of artists who love Arches 140 lb cold pressed. Heavier paper is stiffer and more forgiving. I use 300 lb if possible

#### **Painting Tools**

Water container (I use a large plastic cottage cheese container in my studio)

Watercolor palette - any type

Paper towels

Water resistant board (to affix paper to to keep it flat)

Masking tape

Drawing pencil (regular number 2 is fine)

Eraser

Optional ~Masking fluid, (I tend not to use it, but if you do, please bring it)

Tracing paper (will be handy to help correct drawing mistakes)

#### **Brushes**

Please bring whatever brushes that you are currently working with. I will be using rounds (several sizes) #1 OR #0, #4, #6, and #8, ½” or 1” flat

#### **Paints**

Please bring whatever paints that you are currently working with. The lists below are suggestions. I want you to experiment with mixing and to finish your paintings in colors that are pleasing to you.

I will be demonstrating with Winsor & Newton :

\*burnt sienna

\*ultramarine blue

\*yellow ochre

\*viridian (green)

\*Alizarin

\*Cadmium yellow

\*Cadmium orange

\*Opera Rose (in very small amounts)

Optional colors - The following are nice to have but not required. Colors are considered by temperature. The list below is divided by temperature and are suggestions as you “build” your palette. The first color on each list are the ones I use the most. You need to experiment to discover what you like the most.

cool

yellow - \*cadmium lemon, lemon, azo yellow

red - \*alizarin crimson, quinacridone carmine, phthalo crimson

blue - \*ultramarine blue

warm

yellow - \*cadmium yellow dark, hansa yellow medium, golden yellow

red - \*scarlet lake, cadmium red light, cadmium scarlet, vermillion

blue - \*phthalo blue (also known as winsor blue, green shade)
