

Alex Hillkurtz was born in England and grew up in California where he is a renowned storyboard artist for feature films, television, and commercials. His film credits include *Argo*, *Almost Famous*, *It's Complicated*, and many others. Alex currently lives in Paris with his film editor wife, Tiffany, and enjoys discovering the hidden corners of the city that sketching and *plein air* painting allow. He uses the language of cinema to inform his images, moving beyond what one sees, and depicting what he wants others to see. He believes that in our too-crowded lives, sketching and plein air painting invite us to move at a more deliberate pace... a true sense of place, and sometimes unexpected stories are revealed.

EXHIBITS

Thanks to all of you who suggested possible venues for exhibits. Several of them appear promising and I am looking into them.

Our exhibit at **Ginger Cove** will end Friday, February 3. I don't know if there were any sales but I do know that the residents greatly enjoy having our paintings in their gallery. We look forward to returning at the end of this year.

We have once again been invited to exhibit at **Woods Memorial Presbyterian Church** in Severna Park in September. More details will follow in the newsletter and on our website.

We have an exciting event coming up in April (the 22nd to be exact). This project is still in its early planning stages but will be a celebration of Earth Day at **St. Luke's Episcopal Church** in Eastport. This is a small, lovely church, built in 1956, next to the strip mall and sandwiched between the Watergate Apartments and Severn House condos. You have probably passed by it a hundred times and never noticed it was there. I know I have. But, back behind the building there is a strip of woodland, four acres in area, full of walking trails and a stream, extending all the way to Back Creek. Even though you're surrounded by condos and apartments, when you're there, you feel as though you're deep in a forest.

This is a perfect location for photography, *plein air* painting and urban sketching. The area is open to the public so you're welcome to stop by at any time to wander or create. The paths are clearly marked.

Reverend Lauren Bloom and event chairlady, Connie Harold, are already full of ideas and planning to engage artists, poets, musicians, dancers and others involved in the arts to celebrate our fragile planet through their creativity. There will be workshops, especially for youngsters, talks by environmentalists and dignitaries as well as performances, many in the amphitheater beside the building. There is exhibit space in the well-lit lower level of the church. They plan to install display panels for an exhibit and there will be tables for showcasing flat and unframed items such as sketchbooks.

I met with Rev. Bloom and Connie on January 20. We brainstormed for a few hours and we all came away enthusiastic about the possibilities for the event.

- It would be wonderful if some of us who would like to try something different, would volunteer to collaborate with a musician or a poet or writer, to produce a painting that is based on that person's writing or music. This could possibly work the other way 'round where the writer might want to create a poem influenced by a painting. These paintings would be displayed while the poet is reading or the musician is performing. I don't know where this will lead or if it will be successful at all, but it's worth a try. Please let me know if you might be interested in participating and we will take it from there. joan21409@gmail.com
- The woodland and stream should be gorgeous in April with new growth sprouting everywhere, and I'd like to recommend that plein air artists go to the site to paint or sketch before the event and exhibit your sketchbooks or unframed, maybe even incomplete, paintings on the tables. We'd also like to see you sketching and painting throughout the grounds on the day of the event. In addition to being surrounded by the beauty of budding spring foliage, you'll be serenaded by a choir of birds and frogs while you work.
- In addition, there will be wall space for a hanging exhibit in the lower level of the church (we'll try for two paintings per artist). They should be, of course, relating to the earth/nature theme. Work can be for sale if you wish. There will be a commission on sales, probably 30%, as well as a small entry fee. More details will come in next month's newsletter.
- If anyone would be interested in donating a painting to their raffle or silent auction, it will be appreciated. Definitely no pressure.

I think we will be sharing space and events with the **Muddy Creek Artists**, which I am sure will be a positive collaboration. They are a very creative group.

Obviously, this is just the beginning and there are many details to be worked out over the next couple months, but I feel that it's a good opportunity for AWC to contribute to the community as well as

MONTHLY FEATURED ARTIST Ardythe Jolliffe


