

ALL ARTISTS - SAVE THE DATE April 22, 2023

Greetings Artists,

This is a reminder about our participation in the Earth Day Festival at **St. Luke's Church in Eastport** on April 22. This promises to be a fun day with a lot of visitors and participants - and activities. It will be a celebration of all the arts and their relationship to the fragile beauty of our endangered natural world.

Exhibit: We have been invited to be the featured art organization and will be exhibiting in the lower level of the church, with a few photographers and painters as well as a stained glass artist. There will be events in that spacious room all day so we'll have a lot of visibility.

Receiving: We will be receiving paintings on the morning of **Friday, April 21, from 10:00 to 12:00.** Please sign up on the AWC website as soon as you know what paintings you'll be bringing.

We have space for two framed original paintings and three matted pieces per artist, which can be originals or giclée reproductions. The paintings should reflect the "Nature" theme of the event. There is some poetry on the website and, *if you wish*, you can select a poem that you feel reflects your painting. Or you might choose to select a text from any source that you feel is appropriate to your paintings. If so, please let me have that, along with its title and author, so I can prepare the labels that will include the text and will hang beside your art.

Remember, there is no commission on sales for this event. All payments will be made to AWC and you will be reimbursed by our Treasurer.

Our deadline for entries is April 8th, but if you can fill in the online entry information on the website earlier, it will be appreciated. https://annapoliswatercolorclub.org/event-5186365

Plein Air: The church is blessed with four acres of beautiful, pristine woodlands with paths and a stream, behind the building, and they're hoping some (many) of you will come the day of the event, or before, to paint or sketch along the paths. We'll have a table for display of your sketchbooks or unframed paintings done on the grounds.

Art Tent: There will be a large tent on the grounds for visitors to try their hand at painting and various arts, including a large mural, and the Festival committee would welcome some of our artists who would be willing to spend some time helping out in the tent for a while. There will be "prompts" for people to try. I am not sure how this will work, but it sure sounds like fun, so I hope some of you will be willing to help out in the tent for an hour or two.

Silent Auction: If you have a painting that you would be willing to donate to the church for their silent auction or raffle (I am not sure which it will be) on the day of the event, it will be greatly appreciated.

Participation: If you can spare a couple hours in the afternoon (we have plenty of volunteers for the morning) we would appreciate having one or two of the AWC members stay with the exhibit to talk with visitors about the art and to handle any sales. There is a sign-up space on the website.

Community Concert and Reception: There will be a free concert in the church at 6:00 on Friday evening, April 21, and I encourage all of you to attend. After the concert there will be a reception for the artists (that includes us!) in the lower level where we will have our exhibit. If any of you would like to bring something to contribute to the table, it will be enjoyed and appreciated.

Pick up: The Festival ends at 5 pm on April 22nd and you are welcome to remove your paintings at that time. If you are not able to be there then, please be sure to come on *Sunday afternoon*, the 23rd, between 1 and 2 pm to pick up your paintings.

Please come and enjoy the festivities on the 22nd. There will be performances, readings, exhibits, activities, dignitaries, speakers, all with a focus on the *Earth and the Arts*, and a lot of fun on a spring day. And, it is all free!

Entry Limit: Two paintings per artist (space for 30 paintings total); 3 matted pieces and/or gicless Commission: none -- donations to church are encouraged

I was invited to join the AWC four years ago by Linda Luke, who was then our President. Linda is a neighbor and friend! Here is some of my background in art and other venues:


With over 30 years of experience in the Annapolis and Baltimore area as a free-lance illustrator, I continue to learn and grow in many mediums of art. I graduated Magna cum Laude with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Visual Arts from the University of Maryland Baltimore County.

My work history is varied: Many years as an Executive Secretary for companies here in Maryland, and in Los Angeles, California. When we moved back to Annapolis, I worked as a free-lance artist, then Secretary to the Treasurer at St. John's College. For six years thereafter, I was a designer for Frazier's Pottery, creating and drawing floral designs on stoneware of all sizes and shapes. After receiving my college degree with emphasis in graphic design, I was an illustrator and technical writer for Titan Corporation in Edgewood, Maryland. In 2006, I retired and became interested in volunteering for organizations with various responsibilities, while still pursuing my interest in drawing and painting.


